

## Scoring 360 Games

The following points are very important and are often overlooked. If these are forgotten, no statistics can be created.

### READABLE

Write the names of the players readable.

### NAMES OF PLAYERS

Write the first letter of the first name of players with the same surname:

Müller **M**.

Müller **P**.

### MARK THE PITCHER WITH "P" IN THE SCORING

### ENTER THE PITCHER'S CHANGE IN THE SCORING

The steps:

- For example, write P2 for the new pitcher who will be used as the second pitcher. P3 for the third pitcher, etc.
- Write in the line below the new pitcher: - - - - " " - - - - and the inning when the change was and 'P' with the number of the series.
- Example for the second pitcher who was traded in the third inning:
- - - - - " " - - - - (3) P2
- Mark in the opponent's scoring (offense) when the pitcher is replaced. A horizontal line below the last hitter against whom the replaced pitcher pitched.

#### PITCHER CHANGE:

M. Goose started as a pitcher. M. Malone substituted him in the 6<sup>th</sup> inning.

Write '---' --' and the inning '(6)' in brackets on the next line of the two players.

Write 'P<sub>2</sub>' to indicate the change as the second pitcher.

In case of another pitcher change, write 'P<sub>3</sub>', and so on.

**Important:** On the opposing team's score sheet, mark the moment of the pitcher change with a thick line at the bottom of scoring box of the last batter the replaced pitcher faced (see page 7, Inning 3, M. Goose's scoring box).
